






Our Founder

Dr. Charles Warren "CW" Williams



medical degree, he Joined the United States Army and served as a MASH unit surgeon in the Korean War. Following his military service, Dr. Williams completed his surgery residency at Kate Bitting Reynolds Memorial Hospital in Winston-Salem, NC. He later moved his family to Charlotte, NC and established his first medical office, the Northwest Medical Clinic.

In addition to practicing medicine, Dr. Williams held membership and leadership positions in numerous local and national organizations, including the Old North State Medical Society, American College of Surgeons, International College of Surgeons, Mecklenburg County Medical Society, National Medical Association, Sigma Pi Phi (The Boulé), National Association of Guardsmen, NAACP, Charlotte Urban League, and the Charlotte Boxing Commission. As a member of the Charlotte Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Dr. C.W. Williams established the Beautillion Militare.

Dr. Williams was a trailblazer and a visionary, accomplishing many "firsts" in his lifetime. He holds the distinction of being the first African-American surgeon on staff at Charlotte Memorial Hospital (now Atrium Health) and was the brainchild behind the development of the Hyde Park subdivision In north Charlotte. In the mid 1970s, Dr. Williams, along with several partners, established East Independence Plaza, the first black-owned office building in Uptown Charlotte.

Dr. Williams' passion was for his family, his patients, and the community he so diligently served. He envisioned a place where the medically undeserved and economically disadvantaged of Mecklenburg County could receive quality health care. In 1981, his vision came to fruition with the establishment of The C.W. Williams Community Health Center, Inc., where he served as the Center's first medical director until his death in 1982. The Center has been an Integral part of the Charlotte community for more than 42 years and continues to provide quality services and resources to those in need.

Message from the Chief Executive Officer

At The C.W. Williams Community Health Center, Inc. (CWWCHC or the Center), we believe access to healthcare is a universal human right, not a privilege.

Since 1981, we have continued to build upon the legacy of our founder, Dr. Charles Warren Williams, to make affordable healthcare accessible to all, including the most vulnerable among us. We are deeply committed to breaking down the barriers of income, race, age, language, culture, health status, and geography to provide vital patient-centered healthcare services that transform the health and well-being of underserved children, men, women, and families in the very communities where they live, work, and learn.

While CWWCHC rises to the challenge of service to the excluded, seeing the overlooked, we welcome those with nowhere else to go. For more than 40 years, we have been relied on as a trusted community healthcare partner positively impacting more than 13,000 patients every year, enhancing their individual quality of life and ultimately advancing the wellness of entire communities.

CWWCHC also is a vital & cost-efficient healthcare system that contributes to the economic impact of the very systems in which we serve: North Carolina's Anson, Cabarrus, Gaston, and Union counties. As we are aware, many communities in NC are acutely lacking in healthcare resources, have high unemployment rates, and dangerously restrict access to dependable medical care, which is critically affected by shortages of medical and dental professionals. The C.W. Williams Community Health Center is determined to turn the tables on the healthcare inequities that have afflicted these communities for generations.

We believe healthcare should not be limited by access or ability to pay.

More than 30,000 times a year, we put our patients first. Our patient-centered medical and dental home model provides customized, coordinated, integrated care that improves health outcomes for patients, who are of various incomes and include the poor and the disenfranchised. They are students. They are families. They are veterans. They are addicts. They are diabetic. They are disabled. They are immigrants. They are unhoused. They are Black, Brown, White, Asian, and Native American. Whoever they are and whatever care they need, we will provide it — or help them find it.

As our world and lives shift and change, so too do our patients' need. The number of people who need the innovative quality care and support that CWWCHC provides also continues to multiply. Poverty and disenfranchisement are their daily battle, and thus they become ours. We steadfastly strive to fulfill our mission to serve the underserved by being vigilantly attentive and responsive. Our patients are guaranteed care that is culturally sensitive, reflective of who they are and in a language they can understand. Our dynamic team of professionals speaks several languages, including Spanish, French, Russian, Hindi, and more. And when a fluent speaker is not available, we utilize a language line for translation in verbal language, braille, sign language, and other methods for the hearing impaired.

As a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC), we are proud to be a healthcare safety net provider for all life cycles, regardless of ability to pay. Though we do accept private insurance plans, more than 40 percent of our patients are uninsured, and another 21 percent receive health coverage through Medicaid. Our sliding-scale fees based on income and family size are not only essential to accessing healthcare but also to our patients' peace of mind, as they know that they can get the care needed despite living on incomes as little as below 200 percent of the federal poverty line.

Message from the Chief Executive Officer

We believe in meeting patients where they are.

CWWCHC offers medical, dental, behavioral health, pharmacy, comprehensive HIV services, and a range of ancillary wrap-around services, including holistic medicine, mobile & transportation services that address each individual patient's diverse healthcare needs. Specifically, our medical services include adult and pediatric primary medical care, health screenings, women's and men's care, maternal and child health, HIV/STI screening and treatment, pre-exposure & post-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP/PEP) treatment, diagnostic laboratory services, immunizations, health education, remote patient monitoring, referral services, and a Family Medicine residency program. Our dental services feature adult and pediatric preventative care, emergent care, and restorative care. Our behavioral health services include individual counseling, group counseling, case management, food pantry, support groups, substance use disorder counseling and treatment, and Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) services. For those who need pharmacy services, we offer affordable prescriptions, chronic care management, medication therapy management, and medication delivery. For additional support, we provide ancillary services including holistic medicine with acupuncture, acupressure, herbal therapy, and nutrition counseling; health insurance registration assistance; non-emergent patient transportation; and community outreach.

When our patients cannot come to one of our three community-based health centers, we go to them — literally meeting them where they are. To meet at-risk patients at their point of need, we offer medical and dental services through our mobile clinics. Our medical and dental mobile units are fundamental to providing patients with essential primary and preventive care services. Specifically in rural areas and among some of our most marginalized populations, mobile clinics are often our patients' only means of accessing affordable medical and dental care. Considering that a lack of dental care can lead to or complicate illnesses like heart disease and diabetes, dental health is an important component of our comprehensive healthcare commitment. For transportation-challenged patients, the disabled and elderly patients, we coordinate non-emergency transportation via wheelchair-accessible vehicles that safely and comfortably take them from their door directly to ours and to their referral appointments — at no cost to the patient.

CWWCHC can transform the health and well-being of the underserved in our community.

Our patients have higher rates of disease states. Mecklenburg County has one of the highest HIV infection rates in the country, more than twice the national average. Birthing women of color are 3 to 5 times more likely to have negative health outcomes or die from preventable maternal health issues. By making access to affordable healthcare a reality, it is our vision to play a pivotal role in reversing health inequity trends and improving the well-being of our patients and their communities.

We are deeply grateful for our donors, advocates, board members, and community partners whose determination and generosity support and sustain our efforts, empowering us to bring life-changing tools, resources, programs, and solutions to fulfill our mission, as confirmed by our Fiscal Audit, HRSA Onsite Reviews, and a host of other regulatory reviews held in 2023.

New Services for the Community.

Our newest additions are our state-of-the-art medical building at 3333 Wilkinson Blvd, Charlotte 28208, opening in Summer 2024, Patient Advocacy, Maternal and Child Health services, and our Family Medicine Residency Program that will welcome its first class in 2025.

With purpose and presence, and with the assistance and support from you, our dedicated and committed providers, staff and leadership team, our health safety net partners, funders, and key stakeholders, we have the power to transform the health and well-being of underserved children, men, women, and families by championing expanded access to affordable healthcare, responding with urgency to unique and complex community needs, and raising the bar on healthcare outcomes — ultimately advancing the health, hope, and quality of life of entire communities throughout Mecklenburg and surrounding counties.





LATEST IN FINANCIAL NEWS....











- CWWCHC's financial audit for fiscal year ending March 31, 2023 shows the organization to be a low-risk auditee with no material findings. The agency's financial audit for FY ending March 31, 2022 indicated the same.
- CWWCHC demonstrated 100% compliance with its 2023 Operational Site Visit (OSV) conducted by the Federal Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). This comprehensive assessment reviews information related to statutory and regulatory program and fiscal management of health center operations.
- In 2023, CWWCHC handled more than 30,000 patient encounters and invested over \$6 million in programs and services to improve lives in the communities we serve.

Keynote Speaker



Jewel Mullen, MD, MPH

Jewel Mullen, M.D., MPH, serves as the Associate Dean for Health Equity at the University of Texas Dell Medical School and an Associate Professor in the school's Population Health and Internal Medicine Departments. Dr. Mullen is an Internist, Epidemiologist, public health physician leader, and former Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for Health for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). While at HHS, Mullen served as the acting Assistant Secretary for Health and Acting Director of the National Vaccine Program Office during the months bridging the transition from the Obama to Trump administrations. Prior to her time at HHS, Mullen served five years as Commissioner of the Connecticut Department of Public Health. She also is a former Director of the Bureau of Community Health and Prevention at the Massachusetts Department of Public Health, Medical Director of Baystate Mason Square Neighborhood Health Center in Springfield, Massachusetts, and faculty member at the New York University, University of Virginia, Yale University and Tufts University Schools of Medicine.

As Connecticut's Public Health Commissioner, Dr. Mullen created an Office of Health Equity Research, Evaluation and Policy to ensure that reducing disparities was included as a deliberate, measurable outcome of the Department's programmatic and regulatory efforts. She also successfully spearheaded initiatives to reduce racial disparities in low birth weight and infant mortality, advanced legislation to improve end-of-life care, and led development of the State's Health Assessment and Health improvement plan. As Commissioner, Dr. Mullen also directed her agency's response to events such as natural disasters, the tragic shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School, and infectious disease outbreaks such as Ebola.

Dr. Mullen serves on the editorial board of the CDC's Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report, the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's Policies for Action National Advisory Committee, the Alzheimer's Association/CDC Healthy Brain Initiative Leadership Committee, and the Medical Education Committee for the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. She also is a member of the Committee on a National Strategy for Cancer Control in the United States at the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine. A former member of the Advisory Committee to the CDC Director and its subcommittee on health disparities, Mullen chaired the CDC's Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection and Control Federal Advisory Committee. She also is a former President of the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials.

Board-certified in internal medicine, Mullen received her bachelor's degree and Master of Public Health from Yale University, where she also completed a post-doctoral fellowship in psychosocial epidemiology. She graduated from the Mount Sinai School of Medicine and completed her residency at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Mullen also holds a Master of Public Administration from Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. Dr. Mullen is internationally recognized as a leader in building effective community-based chronic disease prevention programs and for her accomplishments in improving individual and population health. Her esteemed career has included clinical, research, teaching, and administrative roles focused on improving the health of all people, especially the underserved. Dr. Mullen's numerous awards include Outstanding Provider of the Year (Yale University Health Services), Trailblazer Award (Connecticut Voices of Women of Color), and Winslow Centennial Honor Roll for Excellence and Service (Association of Yale Alumni in Public Health).

THE DR. C.W. WILLIAMS HEALTH SERVICE AWARD



Alma S. Adams, Ph.D. U.S. Congresswoman


Dr. Alma S. Adams was elected to her fifth full term representing the 12th Congressional District of North Carolina on November 3, 2022. She has served as Congresswoman since 2014 after winning a special election. Dr. Adams currently serves on the Committee on Education & the Workforce and the House Committee on Agriculture. She also serves on the subcommittee on Higher Education and Workforce Development and is Ranking Member on the Subcommittee on Workforce Protections. Additionally, she serves on the House Agriculture Subcommittee on Nutrition, Foreign Agriculture and Horticulture, and the Subcommittee on Farm Commodities, Risk Management and Credit. Dr. Adams previously served on the Financial Services Committee, Joint Economic Committee and in several leadership positions, including Assistant Whip for the Democratic Caucus.

Congresswoman Adams is the co-founder and co-chair of the Black Maternal Health Caucus with Rep. Lauren Underwood of Illinois and is the founder and co-chair of the Congressional Bipartisan Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Caucus. She also is a member of the Women's Caucus, Diabetes Caucus, Autism Caucus, Congressional Black Caucus, Progressive Education Caucus, Historic Preservation Caucus, AIDS/HIV Caucus, Hunger Caucus, Medicaid Expansion Caucus, and the Art Caucus. Dr. Adams' outstanding legislative accomplishments include the enactment of H.R. 5363, the Fostering Undergraduate Talent by Unlocking Resources for Education (FUTURE) Act that permanently provides funding totaling \$255 million a year for all Minority-Serving Institutions, including \$85 million for HBCUs, as well as the establishment of a new \$50 million R&D grant program for HBCUs in the 2023 Federal budget.

Dr. Adams began her political career in the 1980's by becoming the first African American woman ever elected to the Greensboro City School Board. It was then that she made a lifetime commitment to effecting social change in her community and beyond. Throughout her career, Dr. Adams has fought for a quality education for all students, including legislation to provide nutritious breakfasts in schools and increased pay for teachers. For 40 years, Dr. Adams taught Art at Bennett College. While at Bennett, she led the effort to increase student civic participation, coining the phrase "Bennett Belles are Voting Belles," and organizing annual marches to the polls. As a former educator, Dr. Adams has dedicated her career to improving the lives of young people and her community. She is the recipient of numerous awards and honors, including the North Carolina A&T State University Human Rights Medal, the highest award presented by her alma mater to an individual who fights against social injustice and helps improve the world, and was inducted into the National Black College Alumni Hall of Fame.

In 1994, Dr. Adams was appointed by her peers to serve in the North Carolina House District 26 seat. She went on to serve ten terms in the State House. During her tenure, she rose to become the chair of the North Carolina Legislative Black Caucus and was instrumental in passing legislation that improved the climate for quality affordable healthcare in the state. Dr. Adams also pioneered the Displaced Homemakers Bill and successfully spearheaded the state's first minimum wage increase in nine years. Before serving as a member of the North Carolina General Assembly, Congresswoman Adams served nine years on the Greensboro City Council. Throughout her service to the Second District in Greensboro, Dr. Adams worked to create safe and affordable housing and for the revitalization of neighborhoods. Dr. Adams graduated from North Carolina A&T State University and received her Master of Arts in Art Education. She earned her Ph.D. in Art Education and Multicultural Education from The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio.

Rodney E. Gaddy is retired Executive Director of ONE Charlotte Health Alliance (OCHA). Prior to joining OCHA, Rodney completed a 27 year career at Duke Energy, most recently serving as senior vice president of Administrative Services. In that role, Mr. Gaddy was directly responsible for managing a \$300 million budget and leading an organization of approximately 1,200 workers in the areas of Real Estate, Land and Support Services, Aviation, and Travel Services.


In the role of Executive Director of OCHA, Mr. Gaddy was accountable for leading the overall operations of the organization, while building upon and maintaining strong community partnerships and relationships. Responsibilities included but were not limited to: mentoring future leaders, strategic planning, outcome management of organizational goals, and serving as the liaison between OCHA joint venture partners and various stakeholders. Throughout his OCHA career, Gaddy brought a high degree of energy and excitement to the role, as he was inspired by the organization's mission to support and maximize health and the quality of life in an equitable manner.

Throughout his professional career, Mr. Gaddy always found the time to actively support community-based organizations and causes supporting the under-privileged, through his time, talent, and financial resources. Gaddy currently serves on the boards of Child Care Resources, Inc., UNC-TV Foundation, and Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Greater Charlotte. He previously served as Board Chair for St. Augustine's University. While Gaddy has been afforded many opportunities, he also knows the inequity and inequality that exists amongst people of color, which he has experienced himself. This knowledge motivates him to give back and to ensure that others are not left behind because of race.

A native of Brooklyn, New York, Gaddy earned his Bachelor of Science degree from Wheeling Jesuit University in Wheeling WV. He earned his Juris Doctorate from Georgetown University Law School. Earlier in his career at Duke Energy and in prior positions, Gaddy practiced Labor & Employment Law, Civil and Criminal Law. David G. Jacobs, MD, FACS



David G. Jacobs, MD is a Trauma and Acute-Care Surgeon and Vice-Chair of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion for the Department of Surgery at Atrium Health-Carolinas Medical Center in Charlotte, North Carolina. Dr. Jacobs also serves as the Medical Director of Atrium's Hospital-Based Violence Intervention Program. He grew up in Cleveland, Ohio, earned his undergraduate degree from Williams College in Massachusetts and his medical degree from Weill Medical College of Cornell University in New York City. He completed residencies at University Hospitals of Cleveland and Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Jacobs also completed a Trauma Surgery/Surgical Critical Care fellowship in Baltimore, Maryland before ultimately relocating to Charlotte in 1995, where he has since lived and practiced.

Dr. Jacobs has held many leadership positions, including Trauma Medical Director for the Atrium Health Carolinas Medical Center's F.H. "Sammy" Ross Jr. Trauma Center, Co-Medical Director of Pediatric Trauma at Atrium Health's Levine Children's Hospital's Hemby Pediatric Trauma Institute, and Medical Director of Atrium Health's Violence Intervention Program. In addition, Dr. Jacobs has served as Section Chair and Executive Director of the Surgical Section of the National Medical Association, the largest and oldest organization in the country representing African American physicians and their patients. Dr. Jacobs' current responsibilities include teaching medical residents, research, and patient care.

Beyond his work at the hospital, Dr. Jacobs is a valued community leader. He is an advocate for youth violence prevention and has earned numerous awards for his volunteerism, including the Volunteer of the Year and Healthcare Educator of the Year from the Annual Charlotte Business Journal's Excellence in Healthcare Awards, the Lifetime Achievement Award at the inaugural Charlotte Business Journal Health Care Heroes Awards, the Charlotte-Area FBI Community Service Award, the Pride Community Service Award, the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Medallion Award, and the Carlton G. Watkins Award for his commitment to Charlotte's youth community.

Dr. Jacobs leads by example to build coalitions around causes, improve healthcare disparities, and standardize care across the region. He led the development of the Trauma Survivors Network at Atrium Health, an organization for family and friends of patients with traumatic injuries. Jacobs also is an advocate for ongoing local violence prevention education and is an integral leader and force behind various community groups, including the annual Charlotte Youth Violence Prevention Conference. Dr. Jacob's interest in violence prevention reflects his belief that today's surgeons must also address the ethical, social, and political issues that so greatly affect the overall health and well-being of the patients for whom they provide care.
